IDLE VALLEY NATURE RESERVE AND RURAL LEARNING CENTRE



Idle Valley Nature Reserve covers approximately 450 hectares, primarily wetland habitat, that was formerly the location for significant aggregate extraction activity. The site is now recognised as one of the most wildlife-rich areas of the county, particularly for birds.



The Idle Valley Rural Learning Centre is a high quality education facility based at the south end of the site - a venue for a range of training courses and events. We are working in partnership with a diverse range of stakeholders including Tarmac Ltd and North Nottinghamshire College to both manage the site and deliver training.
