Support the writing of conservation management plans with species and habitat data and evidence.

Line Management and Supervision	:	 The post holder has no direct responsibility for staff, but will train and support volunteers and may support a placement student. Direct and coordinate the work undertaken by volunteers relating to ecological surveys
Responsibility, Budgets and Other Resources	:	 The post holder is responsible for delivering the monitoring requirements of our Severn Trent funded Great Big Nature Boost projects. Contribute to the annual reporting process.
Work Complexity	:	 Act as a credible source of ecological expertise on wildlife and habitat creation and management, both internally and externally. Using ecological survey techniques to map flora and fauna using GIS mapping skills and the wildlife recording software iRecord and Recorder6. Support the delivery of the external funded projects through undertaking surveys and gathering baseline data. Develop and deliver an annual survey and monitoring programme
Decision Making, Creativity and Innovation	:	 The postholder will support the NR teams to deliver the nature recovery and people taking action objectives of the Trust. Work with Trust staff, volunteers and external partners on wildlife surveys, species recording and mapping. Develop and deliver innovative volunteer training.
People, Contacts and Representation	:	• Liaison with both internal and external stakeholders. The postholder will be in contact with and expected to form strong working relationships with other staff, volunteers, local groups, partner organisations, specialist natural history recorders and members of the public.
Working Conditions	:	 This role is based at the Trust offices on Brook Street in Sneinton Market but there will be a need for regular travel across the County including frequent surveys at the Idle Valley Nature Reserve, Attenborough Nature Reserve and other sites across Nottinghamshire.
