Line Management and Supervision

Responsibility, Budgets and Other Resources

• You will have no direct responsibility for staff, but may train, coordinate and support volunteers to help with surveys

• You will be responsible for ensuring that the outputs of the project are met.

 You will contribute to the reporting process by working with the Project Manager to ensure that good record keeping and data is available to help manage the project budget, support the Project Manager in gathering data for the development of the project delivery details, and assisting with the reporting to the EA

 You will support the commissioning of ecological, hydrological, archaeological and geotechnical surveys to inform the detailed project design.

You will manage data and help to analyse the results of the

- surveys, working closely with partners and relevant specialists
- You will undertake some of the capital habitat restoration works such as installing leaky dams and natural spiling and establishing new riparian habitats.
- You will undertake the administrative tasks that are necessary to help the Project Manager with the smooth and effective running of the project.

- You will support the Project Manager to deliver the Project, using your knowledge and skills to find creative solutions for habitat restoration.
- You will work with Trust staff, volunteers and external partners on a range of technical surveys species, recording and mapping.

- Liaison, both internally and externally is an essential part of the job, including with senior staff in our partner organisations, contractors and with the EA as the funder and client.
- You will develop positive relationships with farmers and other landowners, liaising with them to secure NFM sites, providing information, surveys and support as required to help bring potential restoration projects forwards
- Ensure exemplary liaison with the Environment Agency (EA), the Steering Group, and also with other partners who are undertaking complementary work, where synergies can be achieved by working closely.
- You will be in contact with other staff, volunteers, partner organisations, specialist natural history recorders, farmers and members of the public.
